2022 has been an interesting year with Covid continuing to impact on community events.

Restrictions on public events eased in the first half of the year allowing a number of community events to take place, with Clean Up Australia Day, National Tree Day and KIDtober returning.

The BBQ ran hot in November and December with a number of community events like Picnic in the Park, Army meet and greet, Come and Try day for the Special Olympics, the Christmas Markets, a local Jobs Expo and finally 2 X-Mas shows for DCP and Aboriginal Health. However the borders opening up just before Christmas slowed everything down, before finishing off the Rotary year with the St Mark's Feast Day sausage sizzle, cooking and packing just over 900 sausages this year.

Due to a spike in Covid the Bowl's night had to be cancelled in January but we were able to hold it in late April. While it was a bit chilly we still , managed to get 16 teams on the night. A local DJ was organised by Kenton and he managed get the crowd bopping along to some classics (even the young one's in the crowd enjoyed the selection). We managed to raise \$1200 for Rotary Flood Relief. Craig took over the business directory from Trevor this year did a stellar job. We had a small hiccup with the Solar panels on the Shed and needed to get the Inverter replaced (under warranty) but we are currently \$1100 in credit.

The Christmas Pageant did go ahead this year but in a very different format. The floats were stationary and the public drove past in their cars. We entered 3 floats as usual, The Elephant, Mr Squiggle and Bill Steam Shovel. After missing out last year the turn out was really good with around 900 cars going through, many of them repeat visits.

After the success of the Christmas window displays last year we were asked to do it again this year. We setup in the old Alexander Street Café along with Pirie West primary School and The John Pirie High School. We increased from 1 to 3 windows this year and had some wonderful donations including a local artist painting some backdrops for us. We are good luck charms as the Prest building was taken over by Harvey Norman after we finished last year and the Alexander Street shop was sold not long after we removed our displays this year.

Distribution of the Mother's Day flowers was again impacted by Covid-19 restrictions, the posies were delivered to the nursing homes and the staff handed them out. Thank you to Barb and all those involved in organising this. A big thank you to everyone on the Community committee for their support and all Rotarians for their contributions to our activities this year.

Rotary paid for the repair of the barbeque at the Amity Youth Shelter. The barbeque had been previously donated by Rotary. Rotary members attended the award nights of schools in the region to present prizes sponsored by Rotary.

The annual youth leadership events (RYLA and RYPEN) were deferred due to COVID restrictions:

- Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) – Is a weeklong leadership seminar for young people aged between 18-25. The Youth Theatre or smelter apprentices have been identified as potential sources of candidates. www.ryla9510.org
- Rotary Youth Program of ENrichment (RYPEN) – Is an annual 3-day residential leadership camp for 14-17 year olds. The Student Voice group at John Pirie Secondary School nominated two candidates last year. www.rypen9510.org.

A possible future project is seeking a District Grant for a project to build something for youth in Port Pirie. The building project would be undertaken in conjunction with the Port Pirie Regional Council.

Vocation

Rotary has committed to providing \$1,000 a year for the next five years to UniHub, Spencer Gulf. The money will be used by a student from the region for travel to attend training interstate. The student will attend a dinner meeting and make a presentation about their studies. <https://unihubsg.org/>

International

Despite the obvious impact Covid-19 has had here and around the world, making international relations difficult – our committee has worked diligently over the past year to ensure we could identify areas we still could make a difference. Unfortunately, such circumstances prevented us from interacting with our sister clubs as we would have hoped and the “Student Exchange Program”, was still on hold.

We quickly found so many worthy projects to get involved with to support. Identifying one that resonates and aligns with our Clubs values was difficult. We chose to support as this year’s Committee Project the “Birthing Kit Foundation, Australia”. An assembly/packing night was arranged with 200 kits boxed up for distribution. Kits are sent to countries like Ethiopia, Uganda and the Congo.

Individually, committee member Barry Mudge has continued to work on a VVT Program organising a “Farming Exchange” program. Barry plans to bring over a contingent of Moroccan farmers and Agricultural Scientist, mid 2023, for an exchange of farming practices. Project has been fully funded through grants; it is just a matter of timing to see this worthy project come to fruition.

Personally, I have been in conversation with the RC of Nadi re: possibility of a joint project to aid the “Loloma Home & Care Centre”, Fiji which I visited on a trip to Fiji in 2018, taking donations of clothing. I have always wished to be able to assist more. Initial contact has been

positive & well received. President of RC Nadi, Alana Tilly is organising preliminary contact to build a relationship with the home and identify ways we could be of assistance. PE Craig Rimmer has agreed to come on board as mentor, I am looking forward to continuing working on this project throughout the coming year.

Membership and Public Relations

This year our committee also picked up the responsibility for Public Relations and Membership. A challenging portfolio, recognizing what motivates a person to become a Rotarian. A concept we have yet to identify but have had many interesting conversations around this topic.

Consistency and visibility of the Rotary brand was foremost in our minds. We started with the reorder of new club shirts, polos and hats. Through assistance from District grant of \$1K, we were able to put the funds toward the

upgrading of our two marquees which were in desperate need of replacing. Branding of the marquees, bringing us in line with how we wish to be presented & what we represent in a professional manner.

Thanks to Stephen Lynch and his team at Auto Crash Repair, we had the BBQ van resprayed and given a general tidy up this year. Also, a big thank you to Corey Bellifemini from Bellsigns who donated the stickers for the rebranding of the trailer.

From a previous suggestion, we were able to secure free advertising on the big screen at all local SGL matches. With the assistance from “Public Relations” at a District level, in particular Julie Johnson and Graham Fussen (with their input and ideas), we were able to source a suitable advertisement to use. With future advertisements in mind, we would like to see local RC members with local content featuring on the big screen.



A constant theme emerged this year that regardless of what the cause, we should “record the journey” and “tell the story”! Something we have committed to

do better moving forward.

We took advantage of the opportunity to participate in the Polio Ute Relay as it toured across our District, raising both funds and awareness. The Ute took pride of place at the March Producers Market attracting interest from the public – thanks to Dieter for coordinating a swap with the Lions Club to accommodate.
