President's Report

2025-26

Pam Menadue stepped into the secretaries duties when we had to have a last minute reorganisation of the board and has done an outstanding job. Anyone who can organise me and have all the minutes ready each month and foresee what needs to be done is a great asset for any president. She also had a big input into tonight's proceedings. Many thanks Pam.

When we reorganised the board Peter Richens put his hand up to be Treasurer a big job in any club. Peter was fortunate enough to inherit a well organised treasury from Peter Stanley and has carried out his duties with great expertise and his ever present good humour. A sincere thank you from me, Peter for a job well done. President Elect David Brown looked after club service this year. He with the help of a few others has organised a very good group of guest speakers who have been very interesting and varied, that in itself is a big job. Members were kept up to date with the bulletin which was looked after by Mark Arnold with the able assistance of Roger Crouch. Many clubs these days don't run a Sargent of arms but we have several and I think most meetings are made more enjoyable with a bit of humour and some extra cash raised. Thanks to Stephen Lynch, Pam Menadue, Craig Rimmer, Rory Good and Chris Keane with the occasional guest appearance of Greg Hudson , Peter Richens , David Brown and myself.

Membership was looked after by club service and at the beginning of the year. I issued the challenge for everyone to introduce 1 new member to the club, we have, at the time of writing this managed 4 but are still a little short of our goal. We have had to move venues this year and club service with the assistance of Craig Rimmer has enabled us to find a new home here at the Port Club Rooms. This move occurred seamlessly and I hope we have a long association with this venue. Bill Akker has looked after our attendance records again this year and Graham Nichols has sent out the weekly meeting notices.

So well done to President Elect David and his committee.

Community Service was chaired by Craig Rimmer. I sometimes think we should rename this committee the BBQ committee as that is how we make most of our money these days. Craig has kept a record of the hours that have been volunteered by members and it exceeds 530, an outstanding effort. A highlight of the year has been the upgrade of our catering van. Originally we looked at buying a new BBQ trailer but the costs were prohibitive and Roger Crouch suggested that we renovate the catering van, which although useful was not being used to its full advantage. Roger with the ideas of others pretty well single headedly took on the job and consequently we now have a very user friendly, compliant catering van which cost us a fraction of the cost of a new trailer. As I mentioned earlier Craig Rimmer was instrumental in finding a home for us here at these club rooms. We once again this year had a very successful Bowls night even though it had to be moved from January to March because of the weather. Kenton Franks organised the night and I would suggest that we look at keeping the date in March as it was such a success. Our stage and marquee have been hired again this year and once again we have had variety of members assist with these movements. Thanks Chairman Craig and your members.

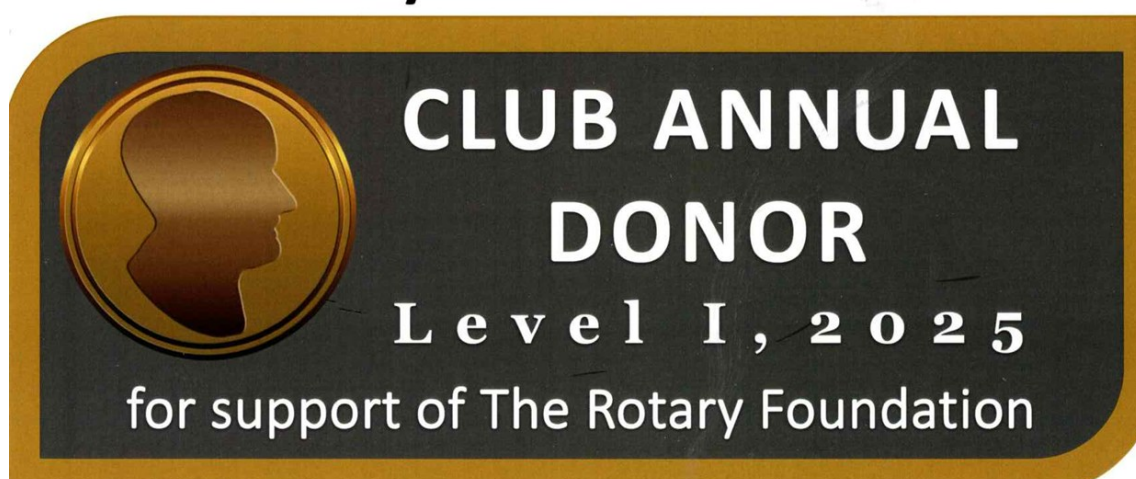


The Vocational/ International committee was chaired initially by Marilyn Hayman. Marilyn was a bit reticent about taking on the job but she did it well. We supported 4 high schools with end of year awards and this year for the first time for many years had a RYLA awardee in Curtis Paterson. Curtis did so well that I believe he has been invited back in the next year as a mentor. Unfortunately Marilyn became ill during the year and sadly passed away only a few weeks ago, she will be greatly missed not only for her good humour and entertaining use of the English language but for her willingness to put her hand up to work on any project. When she became ill Immediate Past President Greg Hudson stepped into the role of Chair for that committee and ensured that it continued to run well, thanks Greg.

Once again Foundation has been in the hands of PDG John Rowe who has ensured that projects that we have been involved in recently have been signed off and all the paper work has been completed. John has always been a great advocate for the Foundation and informed us this year that we as a club over the past 70 years have contributed \$300,000 US to the foundation, something that we should be very proud of.

My Presidents project this year was the medical centre for the Ukraine. After a Club visit to Peterborough where we heard about the plight of the people of the Ukraine with the war against Russia we came home saying that we should be able to fund a relocatable medical centre

I then approached the other clubs in our group and 8 of them joined us in this endeavour. I am pleased to see that Peterborough, Clare, Northern York Peninsular and Maitland are represented tonight as they all joined us in this project. The 8 clubs donated half the money and Pt Pirie put in the balance. That means that as I speak Ukrainians are being treated in a \$28,000 medical centre that we, the people of regional South Australia supplied. I am very proud of this project and I was delighted at the way you as members supported me in its delivery.

So in conclusion I must thank Denise for her support and telling me things I should follow up and do and she was usually right. To you the members of the Rotary Club of Port Pirie my heartfelt thanks. None of this would be possible without your efforts. Without you this club would not exist, without you this city would be all the poorer so hold your heads high and give yourselves a hearty well done.

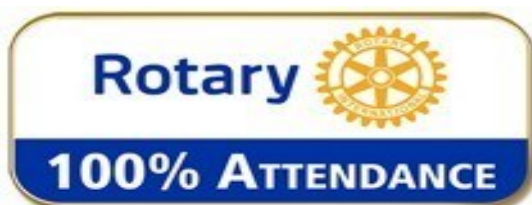

Another year, another thirty barbeque events! A special thanks to Rick Olsen and Kenton Franks, our “shed stewards” for ensuring the van and trailer were both fully stocked with all things necessary to allow for the smooth running of the events held.

The bowls night was a great success again this year. Thanks to Kenton for his administration duties setting up the teams, Rick Olsen who took care of the chickens, Jo-Anne Ferme for organizing the salads, and Sebastian & Angie Mezzino for managing the kitchen.

Funds raised by the committee this year have been used for various items including a donation to Operation Flinders (\$3,000), Shelter Bags (\$1,500) and Rotary Foundation (\$6,000). By far our biggest project was the medical centre for a village in Ukraine to which our club contributed \$13,000.

Productive year kicking off with the nomination of Curtis Paterson as our 2025 Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) candidate – thank you President Philip Johns for Curtis’s endorsement. Curtis attended the intensive weeklong training course in October at Nunyara, Belair. Event included workshops, presentations, team-building, and outdoor activities, focusing on young leaders in teamwork, community service, and personal development. Our Club welcomed Curtis and his family back as Guest Speaker in December to speak of his participation. It was clear from his presentation the impact, confidence & positivity he developed from the experience – well done Curtis!

Rory Good has taken charge of the RYLA and RYPEN programs on behalf of our committee and has been developing a process to make these opportunities more visible and accessible to the target audience. Rory has been canvassing Schools, TAFE, Uni-Hub etc getting the message out of the merits of these programs.

The Club once again, kindly supported the Rotary Youth Citizen Awards. The schools involved were St. Mark’s College, Christian College, Port Pirie High School, Booleroo School and Gladstone High School. Thank you to those Rotarians who took the time to present awards to the deserving recipients. The Club also supported Risdon Primary School end of year academic awards through sponsorship via stage hire in leu of payment.

The “Greg Mayfield Literacy Award” was back on the agenda this year. Thank you to Stephen Lynch for coordinating the program. Stephen is currently reviewing criteria and audience has been decided on as Year-7 students.

Our committee has again organised an assembly day/night in conjunction with the “Birthing Kit Foundation - Australia”. This foundation provides birthing kits and education in clean birthing practices to women birthing at home in remote regions of the developing world.

The assembly night will consist of putting together by members 200 kits consisting of plastic sheet, soap, gloves, string, scalpel, gauze. Thank you to Dannielle for taking the lead to organise this worthy event. Throughout the year on the 5th Thursday – Vocation Night, we attended various locations. This year we joined the RSL in July for a dinner meeting and an excursion through the museum, Thrive Health Centre in October, tour of facilities and function and were warmly welcomed back for a night of fellowship at the Archery Club in April. Three great locations to visit.

On behalf of Marilyn, Stephen and I, we thank the members of this Committee for all your support, ideas and energy during the year.

Our committee congratulates President Philip on a very successful year and thank him for his leadership.

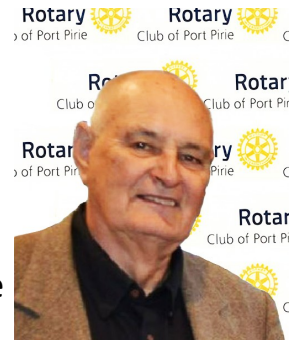

ROTARY FOUNDATION REPORT

PDG John Rowe



During the current year our club and members have contributed more than \$7,000US to the Rotary Annual Programs Fund, taking the Club and Members, all time giving to **\$US300,060** as of 1/6/2026. Today the club has 24 Paul Harris Fellows with a club membership of 32 members. The other reportable facts are the club has 1 Benefactor, 1 Bequest Society member, and 2 Major Donors. As a club we should be proud of this achievement.

Our Global Grant 2343829 for the Water Project with the Rotary Club of Baguio is still on going I have contacted the South Pacific Office for assistance to resolve the grant report status. I believe the Grant has been completed and water is now available in the Barangay.

The project was for the provision of a Water System for Barangay Poblacion, Kabayan , Dutab (Chuntug and Opdas). The Primary Contact is currently Francis Ali Morales the Club President of Baguio. The next Report is due in July. Our completed Global Grant 2577783 is with the Rotary Club of Meycauayan Uptown for the communities of Nueva Ecija and Bulacan. Eight poor elementary schools were identified in the community assessment process. Four schools in each of the two communities have received potable water. During the Needs Assessment the team witnessed the lack of a water source.

The surrounds were basically dirty and unsanitary which is reflected in the health of the community. The beneficiaries had to walk up to a mile to fetch clean water. These conditions would be unacceptable in Australia.

This project has cost US\$30,914 and has been funded by US\$10,000 from our District Designated Fund and AU\$524 from our Club. District 3770 have contributed US\$7,000.

The Rotary Foundation has contributed US\$13,594 from the Foundations World Fund.

The Grant has been a very successful project and has had the final report submitted and accepted by the Foundation. The Grant has been closed and hence completed.

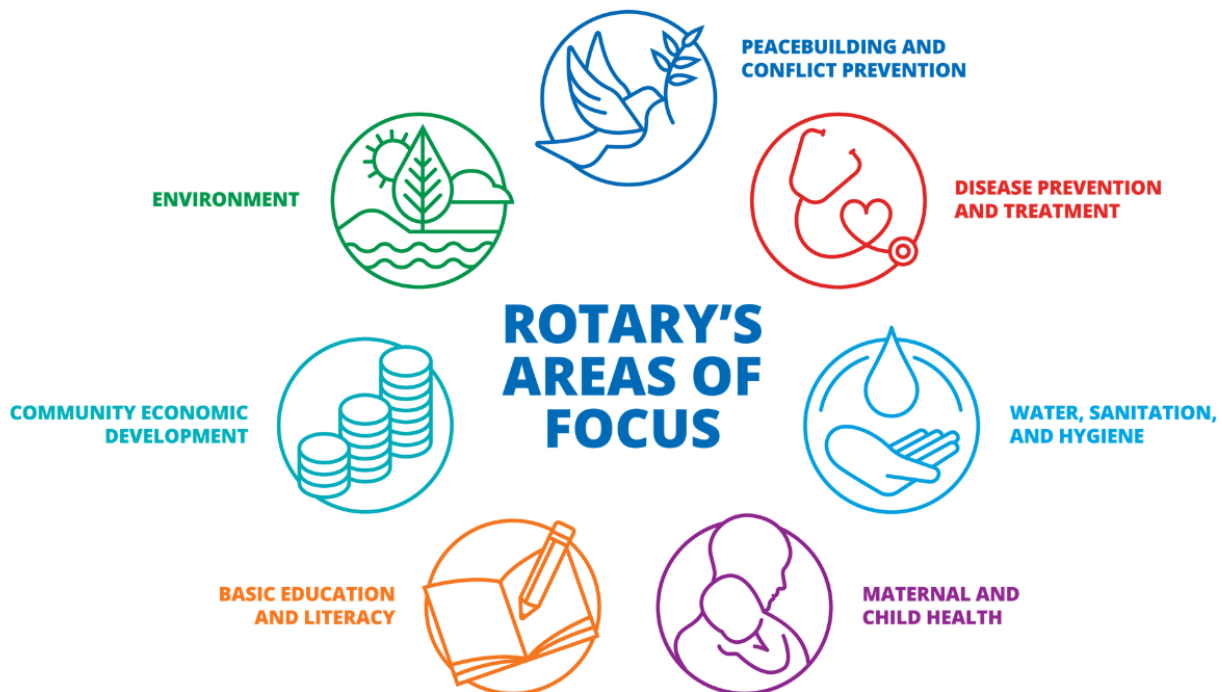

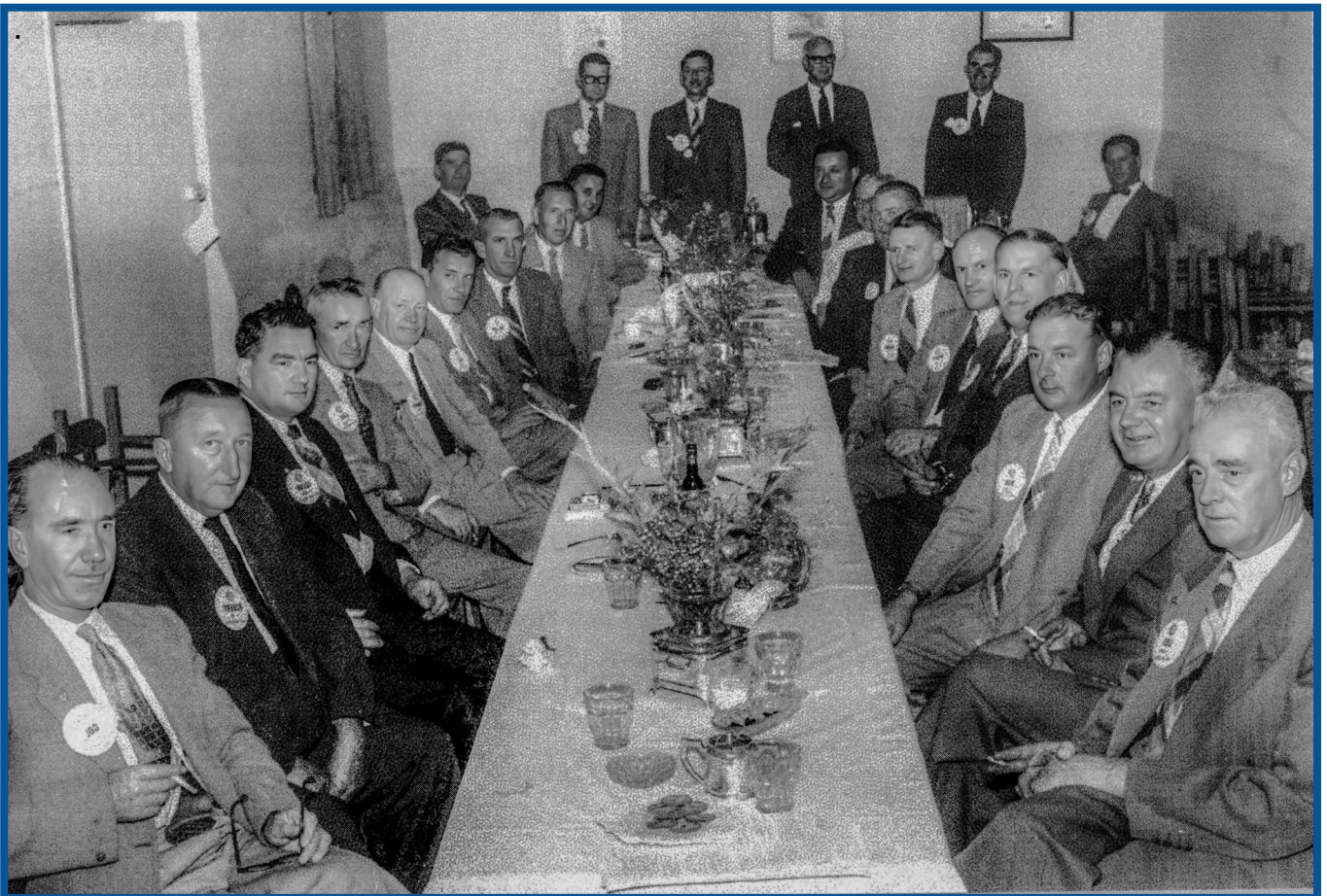
